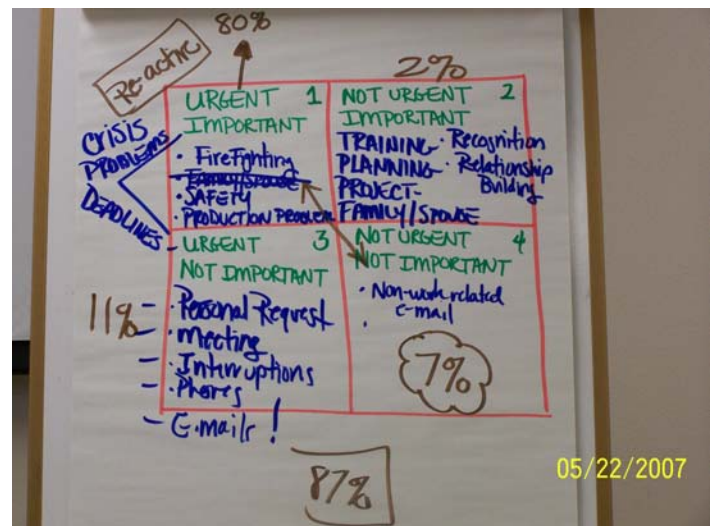
Public Relations Committee

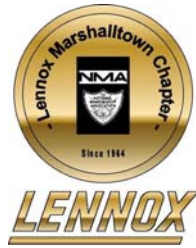
