The primary purpose of the NMA American Enterprise Speech Contest is to promote a better understanding of the American Enterprise System among high school students. Involving youth in researching, writing and delivering a speech on our economic system increases the awareness of audiences—faculty, family, friends, and NMA members—as to the important role that a free economy plays in a free society. This contest also provides an incentive for the development of communication skills that are vital to those entering the workforce and to American business. And, finally, the financial rewards help winning students to further their formal education.

The Council contest, which is the second level of a four-level national contest, includes winning speakers from the individual sponsoring chapters (first level contests) This year we have two chapters participating—Boeing Anaheim Chapter and Boeing Aerospace Leadership Chapter.

This is the second level of the American Enterprise Speech Contest. The third level is at the Chapter Leadership Conference then comes the final level, at the National Conference.

The awards for the third level (LDC) are

- 1st Place—\$2,000 Savings Bond*
- 2nd Place—\$1,500 Savings Bond*
- 3rd Place—\$1,000 Savings Bond*

The awards for the final level (National) are

- 1st Place—\$10,000 Savings Bond*
- 2nd Place—\$5,000 Savings Bond*
- 3rd Place—\$3,000 Savings Bond*
- 4th thru 6th Place—\$500 cash*
