The NMA American Enterprise Speech Contest is the first American Enterprise Activity promoted by NMA that is truly “our program.” It has resulted from chapter initiatives in sponsoring local essay and speech contests and the Community Services Committee’s response in fulfilling the vision of a national contest.

Seventeen years ago, the NMA American Enterprise Speech Contest was little more than a vision. Since 1989, the enthusiasm of NMA members across the country has made it a reality with many high school contestants participating nationwide.

The primary purpose of the NMA American Enterprise Speech Contest is to promote a better understanding of the American Enterprise System among high school students. Involving youth in researching, writing and delivering a speech on our economic system increases the awareness of audiences—faculty, family, friends, and NMA members—as to the important role that a free economy plays in a free society. This contest also provides an incentive for the development of communication skills that are vital to those entering the workforce and to American business. And, finally, the financial rewards help winning students to further their formal education.

The Council contest, which is the second level of a four-level national contest, includes winning speakers from the individual sponsoring chapters (first level contests). This year, we have two chapters participating—Boeing Anaheim Leadership Chapter (BALA) and Boeing Aerospace Leadership Chapter (BALC).

This is the second level of the American Enterprise Speech Contest. The third level is at the Chapter Leadership Conference (LDC), then comes the final level at the National Conference.
